
The Surfaris - 'Wipeout'

-Finger numbers to fret with shown below tab. For the Guitar Solo, numbers in () are support fingers used for bending.



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'Wipeout' - Performance Notes

'Wipeout' essentially consists of three sections: the main theme, the drum solo, and the guitar solo. The main theme is a basic single-note melody that can be played at any skill level. The other sections will be more-challenging, requiring the use of moveable chord shapes and soloing techniques. The following sections provide a step-by-step approach.

Main Theme

(Use a Pick) As a first step, simply try to play section 1 a few times without errors and with clarity.

To get a better sense of timing, try 'counting off' section 1 as: '1-2-3 123 1-2', with the middle '123' count played rapidly and emphasizing the three consecutive notes played on the third string/fifth fret.

<u>Section 1</u> is played four consecutive times. With the first and last note being the same, the note is played twice when 'connecting' each section.

The same eight-note riff played in <u>section 1</u> is repeated one string higher for <u>section 2</u>. If <u>section 1</u> is practiced properly, then learning section 2 should not be too challenging.

<u>Section 3</u> repeats <u>section 1</u> and is played twice. The key to playing <u>Line 1</u> is to keep the fretting hand steady and in position. Make sure to play the last note in each section only once as beginners tend to double this note before shifting to the next section.

Drum Solo (0:33, 1:10, 1:49)

The 'C' chord played along the eight fret position is a *moveable* 'F' barre chord shape. The 'F5' and 'G5' chords are *moveable power chord shapes*.

Guitar Solo (1:29)

The guitar solo follows a 'C-C-C-F-F-C-C-G-F-C-C' progression, with riffs that feature doublestops and bends played on the first and second strings.

Be sure to use extra *support fingers* for each bend.

All 'C' and 'F' riffs 'fit' within the standard Pentatonic Minor box pattern, focusing on the top two strings. Simply shift the pattern to whatever fret position (eighth or first fret) matches the chord change ('C', 'F', or 'G').
